NOTES:

- These notes are from the experiences of Jan Harrell, Vicki Mathieu and Averill Shepps.
- Most of the good colors direct on copper are best if applied as 2 thin coats, each fired hot. They may look splotchy after the first firing, but should be a complete covering of enamel.
- 2880 frequently turns opaque use limited firings bets over another enamel
- 2110 is a good, mostly clear base for reds, oranges and pinks
- Remember, 1010 is not good in acid
- 1995 is a good black for backs
